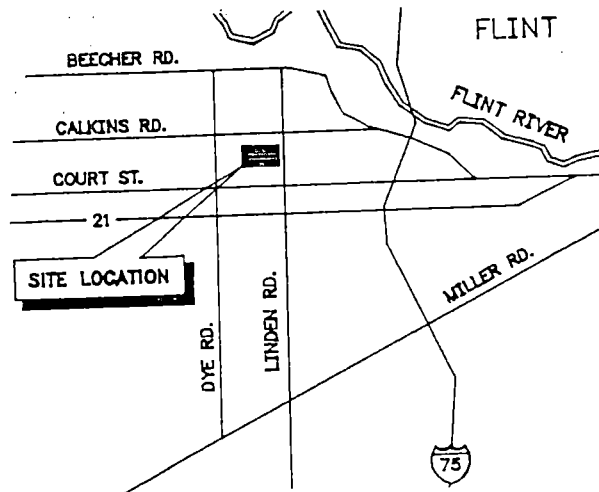
NOTICE OF INTENT TO APPROVE A REMEDIAL ACTION PLAN  
FOR A LIMITED RECREATIONAL CLEANUP CRITERIA CLOSURE

The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) has received a proposed remedial action plan for the Linden Road Landfill site, located on the west side of Linden Road south of Calkins Road and north of Court Street in Flint Township, Genesee County, Michigan. Contamination at the site is the result of the site being used as an industrial landfill until 1969.

This notice is provided according to the requirements of Part 201 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act (NREPA), 1994 PA 451, as amended, MCL 324.20120d(3) *et seq.*, or the Part 201 Rules, 1990 AACRS R 299.5101 to notify interested persons that the MDEQ has reviewed the proposed remedial action plan for a limited recreational cleanup category and finds it to be in compliance with the requirements of the Act and the administrative rules for the Act. This notice is provided to allow for public comment prior to final approval of the proposed plan.

This notice is to provide a brief summary of the proposed remedial action and to offer an opportunity for public review and comment. Written public comments will be accepted until 5:00 PM on November 7, 1997. The MDEQ will carefully consider and address significant public comments before a final decision is made regarding the proposed plan.

Subsurface soils at the site are contaminated with heavy metals, polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons, volatile organic compounds, and polychlorinated biphenyls from the landfilling operation. Shallow groundwater at the site contains trace concentrations of heavy metals, polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons, and volatile organic compounds. The deep aquifer underlying the site has not been impacted by the landfilling operations. The full extent of soil and shallow groundwater contamination has been defined through a site investigation and an interim remedial measures evaluation conducted in 1991. Based on the findings of the Interim Remedial Measures Evaluation, approximately 60 cubic yards of surface waste material was removed from the site. A subsequent detailed investigation of the soil in a 400 foot strip along Linden Road was completed in 1997. A preliminary screening of potentially applicable remedial alternatives indicated that containment, land and resource use restrictions, and monitoring will reduce the threat posed by the landfill to an acceptable level. The proposed remedy includes relocating approximately 36,320 cubic yards of contaminated soil from the frontage along Linden Road and incorporating it into the western portion of the site. Other fill material will be brought on site to complete the regrading of the western portion of the landfill. The landfill will be capped with a minimum of 2.5 feet of uncontaminated soil. The site is planned to ultimately be developed into a recreational facility. Shallow aquifer groundwater use restrictions and prohibitions against excavation will be placed on the deed following the remedial action construction.
