Dear Neighbor:

During the next 12 months, AC Rochester Division of General Motors will conduct a site investigation of the Linden Road Landfill, located on 40 acres on the west side of Linden Road between Calkins Road and West Court Street.

The purpose of the investigation is to determine exactly what is in the landfill.

The landfill site was once a sand and gravel pit and was used as a landfill, principally by Chevrolet-Flint Manufacturing, from 1931 until it was closed in 1969. Disposal records for much of that period are incomplete and the nature and extent of fill is uncertain.


As a nearby resident, we want you to know that the investigation will be conducted under controlled conditions, under a work plan approved by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. The investigation will pose no danger to anyone in the area.

The investigation will evaluate the subsurface soil and surface water and groundwater quality, and will identify the general nature and extent of subsurface debris and waste material. A variety of tests will be conducted, including auger probes, soil borings and test wells. The first on-site activity will involve land surveys and baseline staking.

Some surface cleanup may be possible during later stages of the investigation, once sufficient data has been gathered to allow determination of the exact nature of surface materials.
